Technical regulations and conditions:

The Swiss Cup 2010 will be held according to the ISU General Regulations 2008, the Special Regulations SYS 2008 as well as the valid Technical Rules and Conditions SYS 2009 of the Swiss Skating Union (SEV)

Important: The organizer advises the teams of the Non-ISU categories to refer to the special and adjusted Technical Conditions SYS (see Attachment p. 4 – 7).

Teams, which have participated in the ongoing season in an ISU competition or an ISU category, are not allowed to take part in a Non-ISU category at the Swiss Cup, but they must register in the respective ISU category.

Judging system:

It will be judged with the ISU system.

Official Practice:

The official practice begins on Saturday March 6th, 2010. Each team has 10 minutes official practice on ice for the short program and 12 minutes for the free program.

The official practice is compulsory for all teams

Panel:

The technical Panel / Panel of Judges is composed for each category of:

1 Referee	1 Assistant Referee Ice	5 Judges minimum
1 Technical Controller	1 Technical Specialist	1 Assistant Technical Specialist

Judges:

Judges with the qualification “National SYS Judge“ or judges, who are on the official list of ISU for international competitions, can be announced to the organiser.

Entries should be received with the official entry form V *not later than January 16th, 2010*.

The organiser will pay for meals and accommodation from Friday evening, 5th to Sunday evening, 7th of March. All other expenses shall be the responsibility of each official or the entering association or club.

Judges Meeting: The judges meeting will be held on Saturday March 6th, 2010 at around 2.15 p.m. on the 1st floor of the sports centre.

The “Round table discussion” will be held on Sunday March 7th, 2010 on the 1st floor of the sports centre. Time in arrangement with the referee.

Entry:

The entries of the teams and skaters must be forwarded in 2 phases:

a) form I: entry of the teams name

b) form II: definite entry of the names of the team members

The number of the participating teams is restricted. The organizer has the right to restrict the teams in the order of the enrolment.

b) entry form II for the team members: January 31st, 2010

At the time of registration all members of the team must show a copy of the passport or ID card

Technical requirements for SYS popular sport competitions with the ISU Judging System / Season 2009/2010

Category non - ISU Seniors

Duration: 4 minutes 30 seconds +/- 10 seconds = **9 elements** according to the ISU rules, but **without Moves in the Field (MF)**. The MF may be executed, but will be counted as a transition.

- * The Movement in Isolation (MI) is the only element which will be counted according to the ISU rules (Levels / Groups) if it is executed properly. Therefore, the Levels / Groups can be freely chosen.

ATTENTION:

If a Team has less than 16 skaters, it is not possible to skate the highest MI Group (there must be 8 skaters or 4 pairs which execute the MI, and this is not possible with less than 16 skaters because it has to be maximum half of the Team which is involved).

For all other elements it is also allowed to aim and execute a higher Level / Group, but the Technical Panel will only call the groups listed above if they are executed properly.
